Takes care of University property and maintains cleanliness and order in its premises and on its grounds.


ORGANIZATION OF THE EDUCATIONAL PROCESS

The academic year at Kozybayev University is divided into academic periods (semesters), final assessments (examination sessions), internships, and vacations.


An academic period at Kozybayev University lasts for one semester, which is 15 weeks long, and includes at least 2 weeks for the examination session (final assessment).

STUDENT KNOWLEDGE ASSESSMENT



It is necessary to attend all classes during the training. The final grade for the discipline includes the grades of the current academic performance and the final exam.



Before the examination, the student must familiarize himself/herself with the "Rules of Conduct for the final examination", sign the attendance sheet and be personally responsible for compliance with these rules, in case of failure to attend the examination, the student is given a grade of "F" (Fail) for the discipline.

In case of failure to attend the exam for a valid reason (serious illness, injury, surgery with hospitalization, etc.), confirmed by documents, the add of the session is issued.

KU FACULTIES AND INSTITUTES

MEDICAL FACULTY

The School of Medicine was established in 2018. In its first year, the department welcomed not only students from across Kazakhstan but also over 60 students from India. Upon graduation, the faculty will prepare bachelor's degree specialists who will be equipped to practice medicine in any healthcare facility in Kazakhstan. The faculty comprises two departments: "Fundamental Medicine" and "Clinical Disciplines."








AGROTECHNOLOGICAL FACULTY

The faculty was established on September 1, 2018. It provides education for bachelor's and master's students in various fields of agricultural production and food processing industries. The faculty consists of two departments: "Agronomy and Forestry" and "Food Security".

INSTITUTE OF LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE

The Institute provides training for highly qualified specialists in the fields of philology, translation, Kazakh, Russian, and foreign languages (English, German, French, Turkish), and their teaching methodologies, at both undergraduate and graduate levels. The Institute consists of five departments: "Germanic and Romance Philology," "Foreign Languages," "Practical Kazakh Language," "Kazakh Language and Literature," and "Russian Language and Literature."



PEDAGOGICAL FACULTY

The Faculty of Education serves as a center for providing methodological assistance to educational institutions in the North Kazakhstan region. The faculty consists of six departments: "Music Disciplines," "Pedagogy and Psychology," "Special and Social Pedagogy," "Theory and Methodology of Primary and Preschool Education," "Theory and Methodology of Physical and Military Training" and "Physical Culture".

FACULTY OF ENGINEERING AND DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY


The faculty conducts educational and research activities at a high level of quality, supported by modern facilities and highly qualified instructors. FACULTY OF MATHEMATICS AND NATURAL SCIENCES

The oldest faculty of our university, originally established as the Department of Natural Sciences and Geography in 1937, has existed in its current form since 2018. The faculty comprises five departments: "Biology", "Geography and Ecology", "Mathematics and Computer Science", "Physics" and "Chemistry and Chemical Technologies."

As part of promoting a healthy lifestyle, the University also organizes fitness classes for staff members.



SCHEDULE AND PORTAL

The educational portal (https://ku.edu.kz/) serves as a functional area of the Internet for students, faculty, parents, employers, and the University administration.

The portal provides students and faculty with access to electronic course materials, academic and individual plans, class and exam schedules, information about advisors and employers, as well as news and announcements. Parents can review students' academic achievements, while employers can search for young professionals and post job announcements.



SCIENTIFIC LIBRARY

The Scientific Library of Kozybayev University is one of the largest university libraries in Kazakhstan. Its collection includes over 970,000 books, including notable works of fiction and rare editions from the 18th and 19th centuries.

The library features 17 service points: 8 loan departments and 9 reading rooms.

The collection is regularly updated with new books and subscribes to 73 periodical publications. Since 2010, the Kozybayev University Library has had access to the "Republican Interuniversity Electronic Library" database, which houses full-text versions of textbooks, study guides, scientific and methodological materials, and published articles by faculty members, in compliance with copyright laws.





ACADEMIC MOBILITY

The signs of the internationalization of higher education include academic mobility for students and faculty, as well as proficiency in foreign languages.

Academic mobility involves the movement of a student or staff member to another educational or research institution (either within their own country or abroad) for a specified period, either individually or as part of a joint educational or research program. This process includes the mandatory transfer of earned credits back to their home institution or for continuation of studies at another university. Participation in such a program provides a valuable opportunity to gain experience studying at a foreign university while also experiencing life abroad. Academic mobility allows students of the University to study with our international partners and gain substantial life experience.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

An academic leave is a temporary interruption of studies due to health reasons, including pregnancy, childbirth, or military service. Academic leave is granted for a period of 6 to 12 months (in rare cases, up to 2 years) based solely on the conclusion of the Medical and Advisory Commission (MAC) of the city student clinic. The student is required to provide a health certificate No. 086 annually.

An appeal is a procedure conducted to identify and rectify factors that may have contributed to an unfair assessment of students' knowledge.

GPA (grade point average) – a key performance indicator at the university is the Grade Point Average (GPA), which reflects the average grade across all courses studied. The GPA result is used as the basis for advancing to the next academic year and for maintaining a state educational grant.

IEP (individual education plan) – a document that outlines a specific student's educational trajectory, prepared independently by the student for an academic period based on the Academic Work Plan (AWP); it includes a list of courses the student has enrolled in and the number of credits.

Credit Hour - a unit of measurement for the volume of academic work for students or lecturers. 1 credit equals 1 academic hour of contact work with the student per week throughout the academic period.

Credit Education is based on the student's choice and independent planning of the sequence of courses to be studied, using credits as a unit of measurement for the volume of academic work for both the student and the lecturer.

Registrar office (**RO**) – responsible for recording the entire history of students' academic achievements and organizing all types of knowledge assessments. It maintains the student's transcript and statistics, handles student transfers (from one major to another or from one form of study to another), and manages the re-enrollment of students who have been expelled for any reason.

Prerequisite – disciplines that provide the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary for mastering a given discipline (they need to be completed in advance).

Postrequisites are courses that require the knowledge, skills, and competencies acquired upon completing a given discipline (they should be studied after completing the prerequisite discipline).

Retake – re-study of the discipline in case of receiving the final grade "unsatisfactory" "F" - (fail). Repeated study is carried out only on a paid basis.

AWP (Academic Work Plan) - a document that contains a complete list of compulsory and elective courses, including the number of credits, the sequence of courses, types of instructional activities, and forms of assessment.

Syllabus is an academic program that includes a description of the course, its objectives and goals, a brief summary of its content, topics and their duration, assignments for independent work, consultation times, a schedule for assessments, instructor requirements, criteria for evaluating students' knowledge, and a list of recommended literature.

Transcript - a formal document that lists the courses completed during a specific period of study, including the number of credits, grades, and GPA. An official transcript, which includes a signature and seal, can be obtained from the Registrar office.

Advisor - an instructor who serves as an academic consultant, assisting students in selecting their educational path and navigating their academic program throughout their studies.
